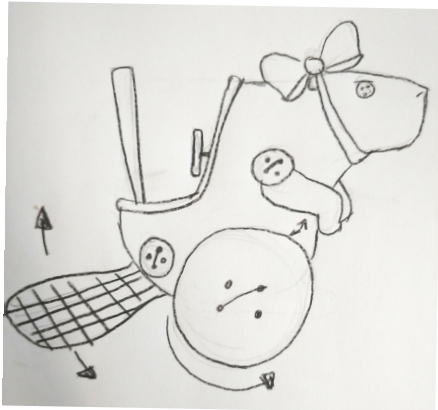
## STEP 1

With your family, go to your favourite place. It can be a park, beach, or even a trail through a forest. Find something different that stands out. It could be something like a statue, a sculpture, a weird tree, or a strange rock shape. Take a picture of as many different and unique items as you can.



## STEP 2

After you have taken a picture of the unique item, begin thinking of ways you could turn it into your own Go-Cart. Try to take the most memorable parts of the design to make it. **Remember** while you want to have pieces looking like the special item you also want it be your own, so get creative!



## STEP 3

Using materials at home, create your Go-Cart. You can use cardboard for the overall shape, some buttons for the wheels, and some aluminum foil for some shiny details.



TIP: To make the wheels move, use string, yarn or a pipe cleaner, and put it through the holes in the middle of the button. Make a hole through the cardboard and put all of the string, yarn, or pipe cleaner, through it. Fasten it to the back carefully with some tape.
