#### *About the RMG*

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The Robert McLaughlin Gallery (RMG) is seeking an engaging, dynamic, outgoing Head Learning Activator to lead our team of Learning Activators to deliver an incredible summer camp experience at the RMG. At the RMG you can broaden and enrich young audiences' experiences, inspiring hearts and minds with a lifelong love of the possibilities within the arts. This full-time position is also an outstanding opportunity for you to gain practical, hands-on job experience in a cultural institution. The RMG believes artists are the essential navigators of our complex times and we work to mobilize our communities around inclusivity, equity, and cultural exchange.

#### *Job description*

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Head Learning Activator is responsible for supervising team of Learning Activators, collaborating with the Learning and Engagement Lead, and assisting with delivery of gallery and studio based art education that is specific for children 5-7 and 8-12 yrs. The Head Learning Activator will work closely with the Learning and Engagement Lead to learn, adapt, and deliver thematic programming that engages young learners to look at, think, and talk about modern and contemporary Canadian art, including the RMG's Permanent Collections and special exhibitions.

#### *Responsibilities*

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- Plan and implement Summer Staff trainings, evaluate job performance throughout the summer
- Oversee the daily operation of camp and basic administration duties
- Design and adapt activities based on ability and age to ensure programs are inclusive
- Conduct independent research on artists, art movements and exhibitions to animate and engage participants in programs being delivered
- Supervise the delivery of age appropriate in-gallery and studio activities that align with the RMG's educational philosophy and program objectives

- Develop, Supervise and actively participate (when appropriate) indoor and outdoor games, and group outings
- Ensure all instructions and activities are accessible, supportive and inclusive for all participants
- Prepare and organize activities and art materials
- Instruct and supervise children who are in the care of the Gallery
- Communicate with parents and staff
- Program and deliver fine-art activities at community events (onsite or virtual) that are set-up for participant success
- Document camp in the form of videos, vlogs, photographs, and providing marketing and communications with required material
- Complete First-Aid, CPR, and AODA training as part of orientation week
- Review and adhere to RMG Health and Safety policies and other RMG policies
